- Plastic bottles
- Drinks cans
- Food tins
- Plastic milk bottles

CANNOT**BE RECYCLED AT HOME**

- Fruit & vegetables - *Can be composted instead*
- Pizza boxes - *Contaminated with grease and food. All materials should be clean and dry.*
- Plastic bags
- Sweet wrappers
- Disposable coffee cups - *Made from mixed materials*
- Nappies
- Electricals
